Med Card **Stomach Protection:** Steroids (dexamethasone. prednisone, prednisolone) or NSAIDs can be very harmful to the stomach lining. Be proactive with

Pepcid AC (famotidine). Red flags: not eating > vomiting > red or black blood in diarrhea.

**Washout**: Vets who practice safe use of anti-inflammatories look for a washout time of 4 -7 days if needing to switch NSAID<->Steroid or

NSAID<->NSAID

**Pain meds** (tramadol, methocarbamol, gabapentin) relieve suffering while anti-inflammatories take 7-30 days to resolve painful swelling around the spinal cord.

• Vet should discuss known side effects • Blood tests for organ health before Rx of NSAID.

**NSAID** (non-steroid anti-inflammatory

NSAIDs should **not** be prescribed with a steroid. NSAIDs can become toxic to the liver and kidney very quickly in some dogs. Read the current

manufacturer's label for any NSAID prescribed.
